



#### Unemployment rates and earnings by educational attainment, 2016



#### Delaware Code

Title 14 § 122 (18)

The Department shall prescribe rules and regulations:

 Providing for the operation of adult education and family literacy programs including, but not limited to, adult basic education, literacy education, adult high school, prison education, apprenticeship programs and family literacy.

### WIOA Title II AEFLA

Purpose:

(1) assist adults to become literate and obtain the knowledge and skills necessary for employment and economic self sufficiency;

(2) assist adults who are parents or family members to obtain the education and skills that

- (A) are necessary to becoming full partners in the educational development of their children; and
- (B) lead to sustainable improvements in the economic opportunities for their family;

(3) assist adults in attaining a secondary school diploma and in the transition to postsecondary education and training, including through career pathways; and

(4) assist immigrants and other individuals who are English language learners in-

- (A) improving their-
  - (i) reading, writing, speaking, and comprehension skills in English; and
  - mathematics skills; and
- (B) acquiring an understanding of the American system of Government, individual freedom, and the responsibilities of citizenship.

### English as a Second Language Programs

### James H. Groves Adult High School

Purpose: Provide eligible adult learners with instructional and support services to complete their high school graduation requirements.

- Goals to assist adult learners to:
  - Enter employment
  - Attain higher levels of employment
  - Enter postsecondary training
  - Enter postsecondary education
- Delivery format:
  - Traditional
  - Distance
  - Hybrid
- Eligible learners:
  - 16 years of age and older
  - Formally exited from K12
  - Passing score on Test of Adult Basic Education
  - Not possessing a high school diploma

### James H. Groves Alternative Secondary Program

Purpose: Provide currently enrolled students with additional instruction that satisfies their graduation requirements.

- Goals to assist adult learners to:
  - Remain in school and gain a diploma
  - Reduce the drop out rate
  - Access credit recovery classes
  - Provide required courses so that students can take more advanced courses at the local school
  - Provide a positive supportive atmosphere for students
- Delivery format:
  - Traditional
- Eligible learners:
  - 16 years of age and older
  - Currently enrolled in a local public school
  - Meets eligibility requirements

## **Family Literacy Programs**

Purpose: Provide services that include: (1) parent literacy training leading to a secondary credential or diploma; (2) workplace skills supporting economic self-sufficiency; (3) age appropriate instruction to prepare children for success in school; (4) parenting training; and (5) interactive literacy activities for parents and children.

#### • Goal to assist adult learners to:

- Attain employment
- Attain a credential (academic and specific skills)
- Enter postsecondary training
- Enter postsecondary education
- Enhance parenting skills so children can be successful in school
- Assist students to be success in school
- Delivery format:
  - Traditional
    - ABE
    - English as a Second Language
- Eligible learners:
  - Low income families
    - Low income
    - Children from birth to 12
  - Skills deficient
  - Not possessing a high school diploma

### Delaware Adult Education Prison Education Program

Purpose: Provide an educational foundation to enable offenders to be productive workers, family members and citizens wile incarcerated and upon release.

- Goals:
  - Attain a credential (academic or specific skills)
  - Prepare for a successful release
  - Reduce recidivism rates
- Courses Types:
  - Academic
  - Vocational
  - Life Skills

## **Eligible Applicants for Funding**

#### Examples

- a local educational agency
- a community-based organization or faith-based organization
- a volunteer literacy organization
- an institution of higher education
- a public or private nonprofit agency
- a library
- a public housing authority
- a nonprofit institution that is not described above and has the ability to provide adult education and literacy activities to eligible individuals
- a consortium or coalition of the agencies, organizations, institutions, libraries or authorities described above
- a partnership between an employer and an entity named above

## Funding

Funding	Allocations	Consideration
Federal and State	FY 18 Federal Funding remained stable. FY 18 State Funding decreased by 5%	Uncertain FY 19 allocations.

FY 18: \$450,000 available (including \$100,000 in software contracts and \$20,000 in teacher stipends)

- Federal and state monies fund this project.
- LEAs receive subgrants and other entities receive contracts.
- Subgrant monies are provided at the beginning of the year.
- Contracted monies are provided upon completion of services.
- Budgets may have to be renegotiated due to uncertainty of funding.
- Timeframe: July 1, 2018 June 30, 2019
