On page 93, Credential Attainment - there are no instructions or timeline for this outcome category. Is this the GED and/or workforce credential? How do you categorize post-secondary enrollment? I assume it's not a credential, but also is not something that can be earned within a year of the program (like listed in prior years). Please advise, and thanks!

A: A recognized post-secondary credential is defined as a credential consisting of an industry-recognized certificate or certification, a certificate of completion of an apprenticeship, a license recognized by the State involved or Federal government, or an associate or baccalaureate degree.

The attainment of this credential can be counted as a core outcome upon completion of the credential requirements.

A secondary school diploma is a diploma that is recognized by a state and is included in the accountability purposes under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act as amended by the Every Student Succeeds Act. A secondary school equivalency certificate signifies that a student has completed the requirements for a high school education. The types of recognized equivalents, for those not covered under ESEA and ESSA, that would satisfy this indicator are those recognized by a state. In Delaware, this would be the GED®. Participants who obtain this type of academic credential must be employed, or enrolled in an education or training program leading to a recognized postsecondary credential with one year following exit from the program in order for this credential to be counted as a core outcome.

Program performance is based on the attainment of core outcomes and measurable skills gains throughout the fiscal year, July 1 to June 30.
