Q #	Question	Answer
6	Please clarify what can be defined as “transit and transportation facility” work. If work has been conducted on a rail station platform, would that be categorized as “facility” work? What about design work on transportation maintenance facilities, etc.?	Rail platform work is considered “facility” work. A “transit and transportation facility” would be anything that supports the transportation system. This could include maintenance facilities and yards, rail stations, park & rides, bus shelters, passenger facilities, etc and any components of these facilities.
5	Page 4, B. Letter of Interest, Part 8 indicates that bidders should “provide a listing of transit and transportation facility related projects for the past 5 years.” Are examples of work for which design has been completed but may not have yet gone to construction allowed, or do you only want examples of constructed work?	We are asking for examples of constructed work.
4	How many consultants are you choosing for this Agreement?	Three.
3	Is it acceptable to DelDOT for a firm to be prime consultant for one team and a sub-consultant for another team?	It is acceptable if your firm has enough manpower and resources to cover both.
2	Page 4, B. Letter of Interest, #6 and #7: On past submittals, DelDOT Contract Administration has requested larger-format versions of present workload (# 6) and listing of contracts (# 7) than can be provided in a limited space in the Letter of Interest. Based on that past experience, can those items (#6 and #7) also be provided outside the four-page limit of the Letter of Interest?	See response below.
1	Page 4, B. Letter of Interest, #8: “Provide a listing of transit and transportation facility-related projects for the past five years.” As firms may have numerous transit and transportation facility-related projects, is it acceptable for the list to be included outside the four-page limit of the Letter of Interest?	The Letter of Interest is limited to four pages on two sheets of paper. There is one page for additional information noted on Page 5, D (2) e) of the RFQ that can be utilized.
