Q #	Question	Answer
1	Is notary required on forms or can that requirement be waived since we are working remotely?	Your notary may be able to witness signatures remotely. If not, for the time being and so long as "social distancing" and telework are a thing, we can accept documents that are not sealed or witnessed. Each signer must certify the document by attaching a letter that says "I swear that the signature included on the following documents (list each document ) is my true and correct signature", or a similar certification.
2	Can you provide more detail about what is meant by "environmental studies" in Item 8 (4th bullet)	In the past we considered turbidity testing as one of those studies. It may be relevant when B.A.T. is being considered such as flocculants and soil stabilizers. Firms may provide oversight to ensure no damage occurs that would effect permits or if permits are affected be capable of including the necessary documentation to provide to our ESO & NPDES folks.
3	Can you provide more detail about what is included in "environmental compliance and liability" in Item 8 (7th bullet);	Be effective at reviewing & making recommendations regarding the interpretation of laws and regulations as they apply to maintaining Department compliance with environmental reporting and other required <u>documentation.</u>
4	What kind of services would be included in "other environmental support services" noted in Item 8 (8th bullet)	Including but not limited to turbidity testing, soil & nutrient testing, nutrient management, confirmatory infiltration testing for infiltrating stormwater BMPs, and supplemental final soil stabilization.
