- 2 Pole Building Structure (060000):
 - Add 1.5.E, to read as follow:
 - E. LEED Submittals:
 - 1. Certificates for Credit MR 6: Chain-of-custody certificates indicating that products specified to be made from certified wood comply with forest certification requirements. Include documentation that manufacturer is certified for chain of custody by an FSC-accredited certification body. Include statement indicating cost for each certified wood product. All framing lumber, including roof trusses, to be FSC Certified.
 - 2. Product Data for Credit IEQ 4.4: For composite wood products, documentation indicating that product contains no urea formaldehyde.

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- Delete 1.5.D.2 in its entirety.
- Add 2.4. to read as follows:

2.4 WOOD-PRESERVATIVE-TREATED MATERIALS

A.Preservative Treatment by Pressure Process: AWPA C2 (lumber), except that lumber that is not in contact with the ground and is continuously protected from liquid water may be treated according to AWPA C31 with inorganic boron (SBX).

- 1. Preservative Chemicals: Acceptable to authorities having jurisdiction.
- B.Kiln-dry material after treatment to a maximum moisture content of 19 percent for lumber. Do not use material that is warped or does not comply with requirements for untreated material.
- C. Mark each treated item with the treatment quality mark of an inspection agency approved by the American Lumber Standards Committee Board of Review.
 - 1. For exposed lumber indicated to receive a stained or natural finish, mark end or back of each piece.
- D. Application: Treat items indicated on Drawings, and the following:
 - 1. Wood cants, nailers, curbs, equipment support bases, blocking, stripping, and similar members in connection with roofing, flashing, vapor barriers, and waterproofing.
 - 2. Wood sills, sleepers, blocking, furring, stripping, and similar concealed members in contact with masonry or concrete.
 - 3. Wood framing members less than 18 inches (460 mm) above grade.
 - 4. Wood floor plates that are installed over concrete slabs directly in contact with earth.
 - 5. Wood Columns.
 - 6. Wood purlins on exterior face of building exterior walls/columns.
 - 7. Wood roof purlins.
- Rough Carpentry (061000):
 - Delete 1.4.B.3 in its entirety.
 - Add the following to the end of 1.4.B.1; "All framing lumber, including roof trusses, to be FSC Certified.".
 - Delete 1.4.D.2 in its entirety.
 - Delete 1.5.C in its entirety.
