ADDENDUM # 1

This Addendum is issued to answer questions submitted by interested vendors, as per the Request for Proposals.

Q1) Can additional brands be added or “written in” when bidding?

A1) Yes. Additional brands can be written in/ added in addition to what is listed under Appendix A of the RFP, Section 1. Technical Specifications, Subsection ii) ADDITIONAL BRAND LINE. Within that paragraph :

“Bidders may submit bids for additional brands (that equally fulfill the requirements of the specific category which the brand is being offered) not already listed on the pricing sheet.”

Equipment listed must meet standards outlined in Section 9 “NIJ Standards” on p. 59 of the RFP.

Also, under page. 59 Section 13. Addition of New Items.

Language that would normally also be used for this is “or authorized equivalent”

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Q2) Please review this section for clarification. The second sentence states “Contractor shall insure that any firearm traded in shall be only resold or consigned to a Law Enforcement Agency or destroyed for parts”. Taken as whole statement it suggests that all trades have to be destroyed or sold to LE. Changing the “shalls” to “shoulds” might help. *Common and accepted practice is that trades are sold to wholesalers. Sales back to the original agency of sale also known as “buy backs” to individual officers who would like to purchase there previously assigned firearm are generally identified before the transaction and labeled as such.*

The section on the trade in of firearms is located on p. 59, Section 11. The purpose is to ensure weapons traded in are disposed of or resold in accordance with Federal and State regulations.

On p. 17, under Evaluation Criteria, under Question 3, please use that to describe you process for trade-in of products to include weapons systems/ firearms.

All other terms and conditions remain the same.
