The following sections of the RFP is deleted in its entirety and replaced as follows:

Page 2, Section II, Background/Program Description Para 2, is hereby updated to read:

Delaware Health and Social Services, Division of Substance Abuse and Mental Health (DSAMH) is seeking proposals from one or more qualified health and social services agencies with experience in delivering substance abuse treatment services to operate residential substance use disorder and co-occurring disorder treatment programs for adult male residents of Delaware. These programs will be capable of treating co-occurring (substance abuse and mental health) disorders, although individuals whose mental health challenges significantly impair (e.g., active psychosis) their ability to address their substance use (or mental health) issues would NOT be a target for this program.

Page 4, Target Population, is hereby updated to read:

The target population for this RFP is for male adult residents of Delaware with primary substance use disorder or co-occurring disorders (substance abuse and mental health). The program capacity is for one (1) 16 bed male residential treatment center. The initial male population will come from transfers from the current Gateway Program in Delaware City. The state of Delaware has decided to relocate several of the programs off the Governor Bacon campus due to potentially repurposing the campus.

Page 42, Program Capacity & Funding, is hereby updated to read:

Program capacity will be 16 residential beds for male clients for each RTC. Programs may not be co-located with another residential program.

DSAMH will provide funding on a limited basis for start-up costs on a reimbursement basis.

DSAMH will provide funding on a Fee for Service basis for services for uninsured clients utilizing the following rate structure:

H2036 Per diem medical portion \$189.44 H2036 HW Room and Board \$45.84

Clients without Medicaid or insurance are expected to contribute to the cost of their treatment according to a sliding scale of fees approved by DSAMH

Successful applicant will be required to enroll with the MCO provider panels as well as enroll as a Fee for Service provider with Medicaid.

Page 43, Appendix B, Scope of Services, Para 1, is hereby updated to read:

The successful applicant(s) must provide a Residential Substance Abuse Treatment Program for Men. This program must be a variable length of stay (based on clinical need and ASAM criteria) model.

ALL OTHER TERMS AND CONDITIONS REMAIN THE SAME.
