Page 6

Text of passage – “Collect fees for redemption of their pet”. “All redemption fees shall be submitted to the State”

Question 1 - What was the dollar value of boarding/redemption fees remitted to the state in 2019?

Answer - \$97,300 was collected by the shelter vendor for boarding and redemption fees of seized, stray, and quarantined pets. No fees were remitted to the State in 2019 as it was not a requirement of the contract in 2019.

Text of passage – “The following data is a summary of 2019 animal control/cruelty/rabies enforcement data”.

Question 3 - The historical data lists 684 cats in the “Stray” column. Is stray cat intake/housing part of the services? If not, why are these cats included in the data?

Answer - The shelter provider is required to take in and care for injured, ill or endangered stray cats that are brought to the shelter through Office of Animal Welfare (OAW). This number represents those cats. It does not represent the total number of stray cats the shelter took in for the year, as they may take in other cats from residents and other avenues.

Question 4 - What were the “other” stray and seized animals?

Answer - Other animals consist of exotic birds, fish, ferrets, rat, rabbits, pocket pets, wildlife (for euthanasia and rabies testing), reptiles, turtles, pig. See detailed chart below.
