Response to RPF Questions

- 1. Can you provide an estimate of the DNREC/DFW staff time available to work on the Delaware Wildlife Action Plan revision throughout the project period and can you identify their role and positions.**

DFW Answer – The staff titles, percentage time during the project period, and responsibility to the project are listed below. Additionally it should be noted that staff time for this project has been identified as an internal priority during this project period and although the following is a best guess there is some flexibility to increase staff time availability if needed and warranted.

<u>Position Title</u>	<u>Percent of Time on Project</u>	<u>Roles and Responsibilities</u>
Program Manger I	50%	Primary contact and advisor for Contractor, liaison to Department and Division staff, GIS data, and data review (Avian and mollusk data) and attend Workshops.
Program Manager II	5%	Assistance with overall implementation of project, data review and attend workshops.
Environmental Scientist II	5%	Review data and attend workshops (Avian and Insect data).
Environmental Scientist III	5%	Review data and attend workshops (Botanist and Habitats)
Environmental Scientist IV	5%	Review data and attend workshops. (Herps and Mammals)
DFW Fisheries Representative	5%	Review Data and attend workshops. (Fisheries)
Environmental Scientist III	5%	Assist with GIS data and protected lands information.

- 2. How many stakeholders groups are anticipated and how will they be selected and at what level of participation?**

DFW Answer – During the development of the first Wildlife Action Plan 15 different stakeholder groups were involved. The Division anticipates that this same list of stakeholders

will be involved as well as a few potential additions. These stakeholders will be involved in reviewing the list of species, habitats, threats and conservation issues and actions. A subgroup of mainly state and federal agencies, as well as local technical experts, will be involved with developing these lists of species, habitats and threats, etc. The Division will work with the Contractor to select the final list of stakeholders and technical experts.
