
- Public event coordination services

- Refurbishing facilities and outbuilding

The Division will engage in a cost share for approved capital improvements.



History

The Judge Morris Estate, within White Clay Creek State Park in Newark, DE boasts a 1790's mansion appointed with period appropriate accessories, gardens and water features that well maintain the historic atmosphere both inside and out. The original two-story fieldstone house was built in 1798 and years later, Judge Hugh M. Morris who added the two-story modern kitchen wing and apartment purchased the property in 193. At the time of his death in 1996, Judge Morris left his estate to the University of Delaware where it was later acquired by the State Division of Parks and Recreation in 1998. The park is located just 3 miles from the University of Delaware and the town of Newark.
